

Millage Renewal Information

Q. When is the election?

A. Tuesday, August 4, 2026.

Q. What is the millage request?

A. It is for the **renewal** of approximately one-half mill (0.4932 mills because of Headlee Amendment rollback requirement) for a four-year period, 2027-2031. The one-half mill originally was approved by voters in 1999 and renewed in 2003, 2007, 2010, 2014, 2018 and 2022.

Q. What is the purpose of this renewal?

A. SC4 uses funds to continue providing programs and services that meet community needs and prepare students for successful careers such as welding, machining, nursing, hospitality, dental hygiene, teaching and more. The millage is essential to keep pace with the technology, equipment and buildings needed to remain competitive such as nursing simulation labs, elevators, accessibility, and campus safety for instructional and student needs. Funds are used to match grants to add services and to collaborate with Universities such as UM, MSU, and SVSU for programs in Port Huron. The millage supports a local college and returns benefits to the area.

Q. Who votes in this millage renewal election?

A. Voters in the St. Clair County Community College District, which follows the same school district boundaries as the St. Clair County Regional Educational Service Agency (RESA).

Q. How much does the one-half mill (0.4932 mills) cost taxpayers?

A. The roughly one-half mill is about 49 cents per \$1,000 of taxable home value, which is about \$49 a year for a homeowner whose home has a market value of \$200,000. The cost for an average priced home in the county is approximately \$1.20 per week.

Q. Will this increase tax rates?

A. No. This is a **renewal** of .4932 mill for operating purposes. It will not increase current tax rates.

Q. How much money does this generate for the college?

A. The renewal of this .4932 mill would raise an estimated \$3.7 million for the 2027 college tax year.

RENEWAL OF ST. CLAIR COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT MILLAGE

Shall the current millage, which was approved by the electors of the St. Clair County Community College District, to provide job training and retraining for workers in the College's service area; repair and update the College's technology, equipment and buildings; and to maintain and expand junior-senior/four year college offerings, in the amount of one-half mill (\$0.50 per \$1,000 of taxable value), reduced to .4932 mills by the Headlee Amendment, be renewed for four years, July 1, 2027 through June 30, 2031? If approved and levied in its entirety, the millage would raise an estimated \$3,749,881 in its first year.
